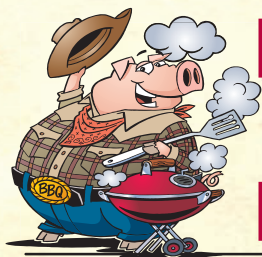

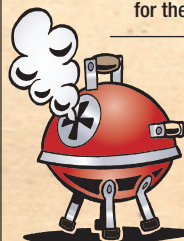

BOARD OF DIRECTORS

The Pipestone County Agricultural Society operates the Pipestone County Fair. The society has 19 members on its Board of Directors, four of whom are elected at its annual meeting each fall for a three-year term.

GENERAL RULES

1. The Pipestone County Fair Society reserves the final and absolute right to interpret the rules and regulations and arbitrarily settle and determine all matters, questions and differences in regard there to, or otherwise arising out of, connected with or incidental to the fair.

2. Pre-registered exhibits may be brought to the Open Class Exhibit Building on the following dates only: Tuesday, August 1, 4:30 - 8 p.m.; Wednesday, August 2, 7-9:30 a.m. Judging will begin at 11 a.m. on Wednesday. Items NOT pre-registered via USPS mail may still be registered for judging Tuesday, August 1 from 4:30-8 p.m. Non-registered items will not be accepted on Wednesday, August 2.

3. All Swine weighed in & in place by 6:30 p.m. Tuesday. Horse exhibits must be in place by 8:00 A.M. Wednesday. All other livestock must be in place by 9:00 A.M. Wednesday.

4. No articles shall be removed from the open class exhibit building before **6:00 p.m.** on Saturday, August 6; the exhibit building will be closed from 5:30-6:00 p.m. for safe exhibit distribution. Open class exhibits will be released at **6:00 p.m.** All livestock entries will be released at **6:00 p.m.** and all 4-H exhibits will be released at **6:00 p.m.**

5. Any person violating any of the fair rules may have any or all premiums forfeited.

6. Exhibitors will be expected to give personal attention to their exhibits and take care of the same until the close of the fair. All exhibits unclaimed by the evening after the last day of the fair will be transferred to the Pipestone Chamber Office or disposed of by the society if perishable.

7. The Society will use all possible precautions to prevent loss or injury to exhibits, exhibitors and spectators, but will not be responsible for any loss or injury that may occur.

8. All complaints should be reported to the superintendent of the department.

9. There will be no appeal from the decision of the judges.

10. An animal may only be exhibited in one show: 4-H or FFA.

11. Where exhibits are not up to desired quality, judges are to give the exhibit the placing or no placing that they think it deserves regardless of the number of entries in the lot.

12. If the fair is unable to pay premiums in full as listed, they will be prorated at whatever percentage the board of directors shall determine.

15. Open Class Premiums will be paid at the time of exhibit release on Saturday at 6:00 p.m.

16. Should an article be entered in the wrong class or lot and the error is discovered before judging, the Superintendent and Clerk will make the proper correction in the entry. No changes can be made after judging begins.

ATTENTION:

NON LIVESTOCK FAIR EXHIBITORS

Advanced registration is required for all open class non-livestock entries. There will be a last chance registration on Tuesday, August 1 from 4:30 p.m. until 8:00 p.m. You must have all entries registered by Tuesday at 8:00 p.m.

Registered exhibits can then be entered Tuesday evening or

Wednesday morning from 7:00-9:30 a.m.

Only registered exhibits will be accepted on Wednesday, August 2.

All entries must use registration form on page 37. All forms can be mailed to the following address, no later than Wednesday, July 26, 2023: Pipestone County Fair, 463 30th Ave, Jasper, MN 56144

All exhibitors are encouraged to pre-register any and all potential exhibits. Exhibits may be dropped if needed. Each individual exhibitor must use a separate entry blank. Entry blanks may be duplicated if needed.

All exhibits must be in by 9:30 a.m. Wednesday, August 2.

No entry fees will be charged.

All exhibits are to remain in place until 6:00 p.m. Saturday, August 5, 2023.

Best of Show and Sweepstakes Premiums will be awarded in each division.

Pictures of the exhibitors winning Best of Show & Sweepstakes will be taken prior to entry release. The day and time will be posted in the open class building.

Exhibitors do not have to live in Pipestone County.

RULES & INFORMATION APPLYING TO LIVESTOCK DEPARTMENTS

Dr. Larry Goelz, Pipestone, will be the official veterinarian. Out-of-state exhibitors are to obtain their health certificates from their own veterinarian.

Cattle may be tied out at 8:00 p.m., not before that time, please.

All cattle exhibitors who tie out at night will have to help clean up the tie out area on Sunday afternoon by 2:00 p.m.

All horse exhibitors must clean their stalls by Sunday, 2:00 p.m.

All cattle must be in barns by 9 a.m. each morning.

No trucks or trailers in front of livestock barns before 6:00 p.m.

Saturday. All stalls & pens to be cleaned each day.

All incoming livestock trailers with livestock enter the north gate only and exit west gate only. Please use the same procedure for loading and releasing of livestock.

Livestock may stay later than 6:00 p.m. However, they must be removed by 2:00 p.m. Sunday.

GENERAL LIVESTOCK REQUIREMENTS:

Livestock and poultry that exhibit symptoms of any infectious or communicable disease, including ringworm and warts, may not be exhibited. All animals must be examined by the official veterinarian on the day they are admitted to the exhibition and at least once daily during the exhibition.

CATTLE: All cattle exhibited from an infected TB area need to be tested within 60 days of exhibition. At this time, there are no state requirements for bovine tuberculosis (TB) testing. However, new intrastate movement requirements may be in effect during the exhibition season for certain counties in northwest Minnesota. An updated version of this document will be distributed once specific information on Minnesota intrastate movement requirements becomes available.

SHEEP and GOATS: Sheep and goats must be identified with official identification approved for use in the scrapie eradication program. This includes wethers.

SWINE: Swine must be individually identified and must: (1) have had a negative official pseudorabies test conducted within 30 days prior to the opening date of the exhibition; or (2) originate directly from a qualified pseudorabies-negative herd; or (3) originate directly from a Stage IV or V county or area. All 50 states are currently pseudorabies Stage V (Pseudorabies Free Status).

HORSES: All horses must be negative to an official test for Equine Infectious Anemia (EIA) within 12 months prior to the opening date of the exhibition. A test is not required for suckling foals accompanying a negative dam.

POULTRY: Poultry, except waterfowl and pigeons, must be individually identified with a leg or wing band and accompanied by a form approved by the board to show compliance with one of the following: (1) negative test for pullorum-typhoid disease conducted within 90 days prior to the opening date of the exhibition; or (2) originate directly from parent stock tested and found negative for pullorum-typhoid disease within the last 12 months. In addition, turkeys must be tested negative or originate directly from parent stock that is tested negative for Salmonella typhimurium, Mycoplasma gallisepticum, and Mycoplasma synoviae.

DOGS: A current certificate of rabies vaccination issued by a licensed veterinarian must accompany dogs over 6 months of age.

IMPORTED ANIMALS: All imported animals must be accompanied by a certificate of veterinary inspection and meet the Board's importation requirements.

DEPARTMENT A**Horses**

Horses may be shown in either 4-H or FFA, but the same animal cannot be shown in both. All horses exhibited must be mares or geldings, except that foals may be stallions. January 1 is the base date for age. Fair board director's decision is final. Stalls cleaned by 10:00 a.m. each day or premiums will be forfeited.

DEPARTMENT B**Cattle**

Justin Butman, Superintendent.

4-H and FFA cow-calf exhibit premium schedule.

Pipestone County Cattlemen's Assoc. will pay Champion & Reserve Champion cow-calf premiums.

No entry fee for any 4-H or FFA member. Only 4-H and FFA exhibitors will receive prize money and ribbons.

Classes - To be determined by age of cow and number of entries.

Requirements for entry: Exhibitor must own entry. Exhibitor may have more than one entry. Each entry to include a beef breed cow (two years old or older) and her calf. Calves should not exceed 205 days of age.

Breeders must be willing to provide the following information upon arrival at the fair: On the cow - breed, age, sire if known and any identification on the calf - sex, breed, sire, birth date, birth weight if possible and any identification.

Cow and calf must be halter broke. Cows will be tied in individual pens and calf may be tied or allowed to be free in the pen. They will be shown in pairs in the show ring.

Cows and calves will be weighed individually at the fair on Wednesday. The calf's weight per day of age and adjusted day weights will be calculated. The judge will consider performances

as well as eye appeal and structural soundness of both the cow and calf.

Clipping of the cattle will be allowed.

Cattle and stall area must be kept neat and clean.

All cattle must be tested according to Minnesota veterinary regulations.

DEPARTMENT C**Sheep**

Wayne Drew, Superintendent.

Number of animals will be limited at the discretion of the superintendent.

Sheep must be in place by Wednesday, 9 a.m. Release time 6:00 p.m. Saturday.

An exhibitor may show two animals in any individual lot but only one group in lots for groups.

Pen reservations should be made with Wayne Drew.

2. 4-H members winning the right to exhibit at State Fair are urged to decide by 3 p.m. Friday August 4, 2023. A chart to check yes or no will be posted in the livestock arena and 4-H Exhibit building. All State fair eligible 4-Hers may take one livestock trip and one non-livestock trip if they choose to.

3. To earn a trip to the State Fair 4-Hers must have completed sixth grade.

4. Any errors in premium awards must be brought to the attention of the extension office within one week following receipt of the awards.

5. All exhibits will be placed in purple, blue, red or white ribbon groups. Champion ribbons will be awarded as shown in the premium list.

6. Only youth enrolled in Pipestone County 4-H are eligible to compete in the 4-H division.

7. All exhibits are to be selected from this year's project work except where specified such as crops or entomology.

8. The purpose of all 4-H exhibits at the fair is to be an

9. Cloverbud 4-H policy - Kindergarten, first and second graders enrolled in Cloverbud 4-H program may enter exhibits for conference judging. (Includes animal science projects). Cloverbud 4-Hers will exhibit as a separate class in the animal shows. Judging will be non-competitive. A parent, Jr. Leader or another adult must be in control of live animals shown in the Cloverbud Division.

10. State Fair Exhibits - If your winning exhibit is valuable, fragile or sentimental you must decide whether the risk of State Fair exhibiting is worth it. At the 4-H exhibit building they may have some secured areas for small exhibits. The 4-Her may arrange to bring the exhibit in for judging and take it home immediately. Because of educator's vehicles we will not transport pieces larger than 19" in dimension.

11. Not all exhibits are eligible for State Fair trips. Some projects have extra lot numbers for county fair only. We have tried to indicate specifics regarding state fair trips in each class.

12. Trophies or other special awards will be given based on the number of exhibitors in the class and donors.

13. No video cameras will be allowed in the show arena during a livestock show. Videotaping must be done from the seating area around the arena.

14. Only Pipestone County 4-H members may show for another 4-Her if they have more than one animal in a class. That means - no parents, grandparents, brothers & sisters out of 4-H, other 4-Hers from other counties, etc.

15. Initial bedding will be provided for beef, dairy, horse, sheep, poultry and swine FREE of charge, sponsored by Compeer Financial Services. The initial bedding will be provided, but any additional bedding is on your own.

As you compete for awards please be honest, sincere, and show good sportsmanship.

Every effort has been made to set up classes which will give members equal opportunity.

Three Divisions: Junior: Completed 5th grade and younger; Intermediate: Completed 6th-8th grades; Senior: Completed 9th grade & older. Note: Poultry, Rabbit & Goats Showmanship Division: Junior - completed 7th grade and younger; Senior - completed 8th grade and older.

You do not have to sign up for showmanship on your entry sheet. You may just come into your designated age category at the time of the show. Please note: Persons in Showmanship **MUST** show their own animals.

SPECIAL 4-H FAIR AWARDS

A plaque will be presented to all champion and reserve animals, plus Champion Jr., Intermediate and Sr. Showman, sponsored by local merchants. Plaques will also be presented to non-livestock exhibitors in specified areas.

4-H & FFA PREMIER SHOWMANSHIP

1. Champion 4-H Sr. and Champion FFA Showman in Beef, Dairy, Horse, Swine, Sheep, and Goat are eligible to participate. If a 4-Her or FFA member places in two species he will decide which one he or she will represent and the next person will be asked to participate. If a 4-Her or FFA member wins both divisions in the same species area, the species judge will decide the next participant. Exhibitors must show their own animal.

2. If Champion Showman does not want to participate, the Reserve placed individual in that species will be given the opportunity.

3. The Showmanship Contest will be held Saturday, August 5 at 7:30 a.m.

4. Contestants will be asked to bring his or her animals to the show ring for the contest.

5. Procedure:

(A) The contest will consist of 12 participants, 2 from each of the 6 species listed.

(B) Each exhibitor must bring one animal of each specie for the contest.

(C) All 12 contestants will show in an order predetermined by the FFA advisor.

(D) All 12 contestants will show the same species at the same time.

(E) Each specie will be given approximately 15 minutes for judging.

(F) Judges for each specie will assign a ranking for the contestants and those rankings will be compiled at the end of the contest to determine the winner.

4. Livestock exhibitors are responsible for keeping their stalls and pens clean during the entire fair period, or premiums will not be paid.

5. Exhibitors must furnish their own feed, equipment, hay and bedding.

6. Registration papers will be required on purebred beef, swine, sheep and dairy animals.

7. Any individual helping show a 4-H livestock exhibit must be a Pipestone County 4-H member.

8. Cattle may be tied out at 8 p.m. each evening **BUT NOT BEFORE.**

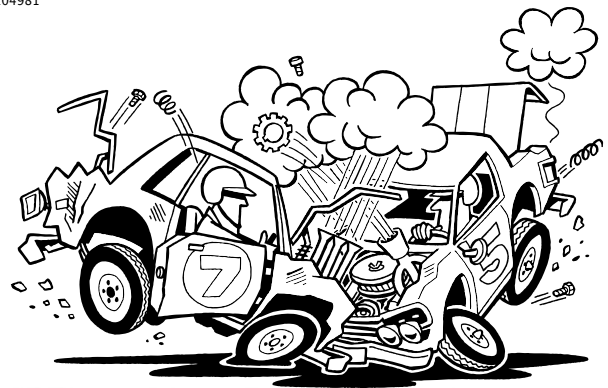
9. Show schedules will be posted at the fairgrounds.

10. All market animals will be shown by weight class.

11. **PLEASE NOTE:** All livestock trailers **MUST** enter the North Gate and **MUST** exit the West Gate.

FFA PREMIUM BOOKS

FFA members received the FFA premium list and specie divisions from the Ag Instructor prior to the County fair. If you have not received a copy please contact an FFA officer.

GENERAL INFORMATION

1. Entries are open to members of Pipestone Area FFA.
2. Breeding Stock - two animals may be shown by any one individual in each lot. Each member will be limited to the number of pens allowed at the discretion of the FFA superintendent. Market livestock will be limited to 2 steers, 4 market lambs, 4 barrows, 4 market gilts or total of 6 swine. 1 Jr. flock and 1 pair calves. 1 pen of 3 market pigs.
3. All livestock must meet health requirements of official fair veterinarian.
4. The animals shown in the FFA division may not be shown in the 4-H division at the Pipestone County Fair.
5. Entry fees are \$15.00 per exhibitor if a shirt is purchased or \$5.00 if a blue polo from a previous year is used.
6. Entries are due July 15 to the Vo-Ag Instructor.
7. All livestock must be owned or leased by exhibitors 30 days before fair.
8. Check show schedule for weighing times for market animals.
9. Market lambs must be shorn within 3 days prior to fair.
10. Partnership agreements must be provided if requested.
11. Wood chips will be available to exhibitors. Please use them wisely on your presentation of your animals.
12. Small classes will be combined at discretion of FFA superintendent.

13. All livestock must be in place by 9:00 a.m. Wednesday.
 14. Livestock will remain at fairgrounds until 6:00 p.m. Saturday except for carcass show animals.
 15. First year exhibitor (completed freshmen ag). Selection will be based on the following: Livestock and showmanship 1st place - 6 points, 2nd place - 4 points, 3rd place - 2 points. Crops 1st place - 3 points, 2nd place - 2 points, 3rd place - 1 point.
 16. Senior Champion 4-H and Champion FFA Showman in Beef, Dairy, Swine, Sheep and Horse are eligible to participate. If a 4-H'er or FFA'er places in two species he/she will decide which one he/she will represent and the next person will be asked to participate. If a 4-H'er or FFA member wins both divisions in the same species area, the species judge will decide the next participant. Exhibitors must show their own animal.
- If Champion Showman does not want to participate, the Reserve placed individual in that species will be given the opportunity.
- Contestants will be asked to bring his/her animals to the show ring for the contest.
- Please view entire procedure listed prior in the premium book.
- Past Champion Premier Showman winners may not participate in the Premier Showmanship contest.

- Lot 1. Oats - present year crop - 1 gallon ziplock bag
- Lot 2. Oats Sheaf - present year crop - 4" diameter
- Lot 3. Three Corn Plants - Complete with roots

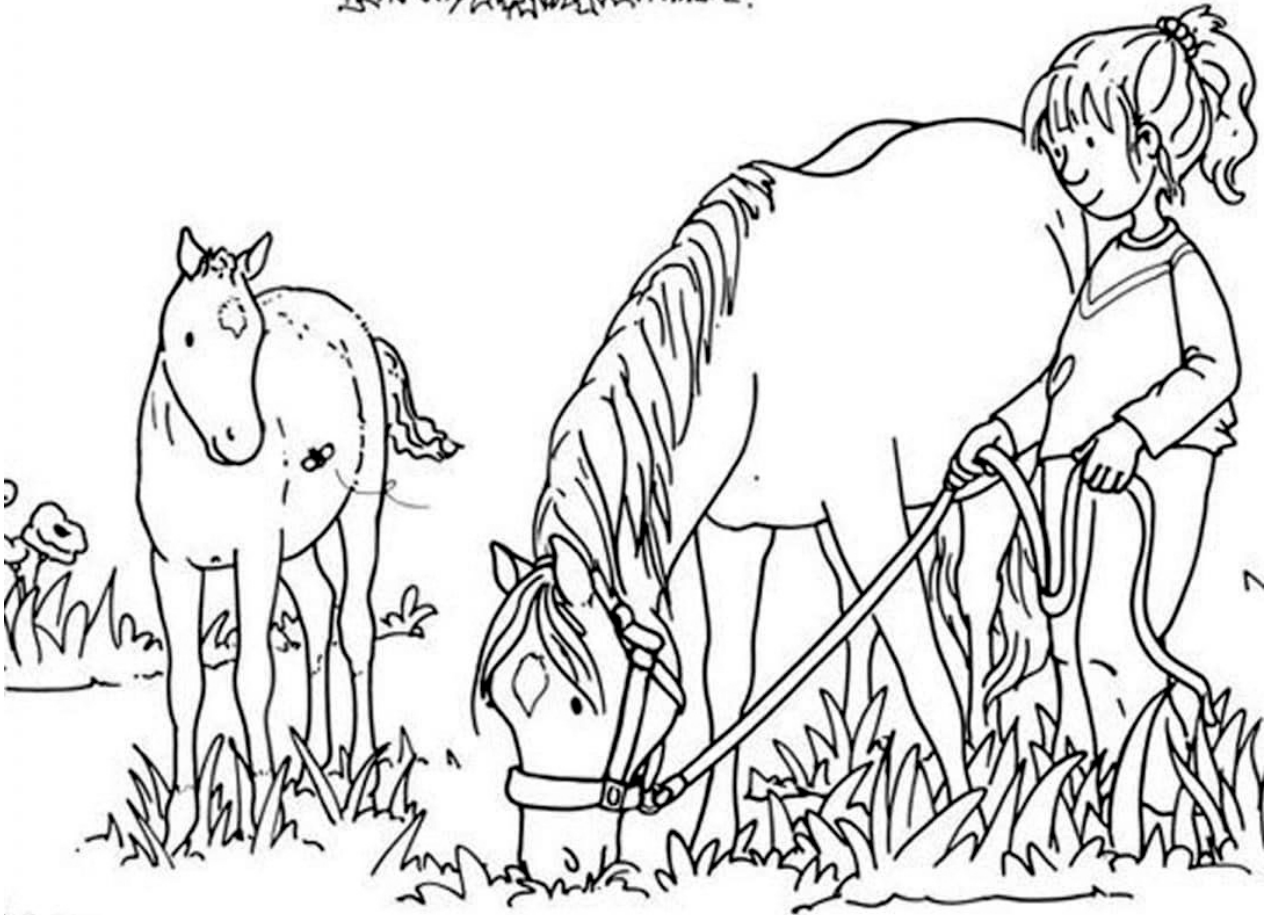

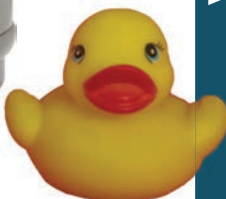
